3. Jack finished 0.4 of his math homework during lunch break. What percent did he finish in the lunch break?
4. A jug of lemonade was 50% full. Write the amount of lemonade as a decimal.
5. At a toy store 60% of the customers were boys. Express the number of boys as compared to the total customers as a decimal.
6. If you had \$1, write the value of 15 cents as a decimal and as a percentage.
7. James made 58% of his shots during a basketball championship. Write the number of baskets he made as a decimal.
8. A recipe requires a cup 0.6 full of milk and the rest with water. What percent of the cup is milk?
9. A video game had several stages. If Bob beat 0.7 of the stages, what percent of the game has he completed?
10. A large cake was 30% bigger than a small cake. The large cake is how much bigger than the small cake in decimal form?
